COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

BEGINNERS COURSE 1 – Essential Social IsiXhosa: Carefully paced so that by the end, you are able to have a full conversation, from greetings and introductions to small talk and farewells. *Entry requirements: Open to all.*

BEGINNERS COURSE 2 – Essential Practical isiXhosa: Equips you with language for everyday environments and situations, such as at the garage and shops, when offering hospitality, speaking about the weather, conducting an interview or being interviewed. *Entry requirements: Completion of Beginner Course 1 (or equivalent knowledge). If unsure, ask us for an email test.*

BEGINNERS COURSE 3 – Essential Small Talk, Responses and Discussions: This course will extend your ability to make small talk and show an interest in others. It will allow you to express your opinion, agree, disagree, and respond appropriately and supportively to both the good and bad news that our conversations are so often made up of. *Entry requirements: Completion of Beginner Course 1 (or equivalent knowledge) and preferably Beginner Course 2. If unsure, ask us for an email test.*

ESSENTIAL GRAMMAR COURSE 1: This course is an excellent preparation for going on to the Intermediate courses. It gives a detailed overview of the grammatical framework provided by the isiXhosa noun groups. You will learn how to understand, create and memorize key noun group concords. The course also teaches vocabulary and sentence structure, giving students a foundational introduction to the way isiXhosa operates. *Entry requirements: Completion of Beginner Course 1 and 2 and preferably also Course 3 (or equivalent knowledge).*

The Intermediate Courses grow the learner’s tools for Conversational isiXhosa extensively by teaching authentic colloquial phrases and ultrapractical vocabulary, contextualized in realistic and entertaining dialogues. It is recommended – but not required – to complete Essential Grammar Course 1 ahead of the Intermediate Courses.

INTERMEDIATE COURSE 1 – ‘A Mixed Marriage’ – Pithy dialogues in which the wedding couple and their friends make arrangements for the big day: This course teaches practical words and phrases for describing time and for making arrangements. It also introduces you to crisp and expressive phrases for everyday banter. It includes a dedicated section on culture, word usage, and a well-known Xhosa idiom, for each lesson. *Entry requirements: Completion of Beginner Courses 1, 2 and 3 (or equivalent knowledge). If unsure, ask us for an email test.*

INTERMEDIATE COURSE 2 – ‘Clandestine Love’ - A family drama using the recent past continuous tense: Each lesson of this course builds on the interactions within an imagined family, where taboo around shared clan name romances creates the dramatic thrust. In terms of grammar, each lesson introduces another key aspect of the Recent Past Continuous Tense. Numerous conversational phrase structures are also introduced. For example, Why are you so...?; I can’t believe that...; I always...; It is necessary that...; etc. *Entry requirements: Completion of Beginner Courses 1, 2 and 3 (or equivalent knowledge). If unsure, ask us for an email test.*

INTERMEDIATE COURSE 3 – ‘A Room to Rent’ – Interactions between young adults sharing a household and their new tenant. This course introduces isiXhosa adjectives and their concords. You will also learn how to make comparisons and how to give compliments, how to say This is and These are, Here is and Here are, and how to ask various useful questions. A wonderfully practical array of new vocabulary, including position words (above, below, etc.) will give feet to the grammar you’ve learnt. *Entry requirements: Completion of Beginner Course 1, Course 2 and Course 3 (or equivalent knowledge). If unsure, ask us for an email test.*

ISIZULU BEGINNERS COURSE 1 – Essential Social IsiZulu: A well-paced introduction to the language, enabling students to carry out a full conversation of everyday greetings, pleasantries and farewells. *Entry requirements: Open to all.*
